A glass ball with a slit serves as a support for a photograph that reproduces a bubble blower (taken from Jean-Baptiste-Siméon Chardin's painting Les bulles de savon, ca. 1734). The young man is associated with an ensemble of spheres and planets, which are in turn inscribed in a cosmic image with a circular format.

The work is part of a group of works with the same title, made between 1990 and 1996, whose common denominator is a figure located in either an elevated or a central position – in a "belvedere", as the title suggests – and correlated with one or more astral spheres, understood to be the symbolic model of incomparable perfection.
